## **Technical Updates**

#### Reminder: 146.76 Repeater – PL NOW REQUIRED FULL TIME

In preparation for the new updated repeater equipment with additional receive locations the controller has been reprogrammed requiring users at ALL times to transmit a PL tone of 123.0 Hz. This change also is in effect when the repeater is in the weather watch mode.

**W8RXX 146.76 Repeater** – All of the new **eight** remote receiver sites are now installed. The head end / control equipment should be operational in the near future. You should notice improved receive coverage **once** the head end is complete. A complete NEW power point presentation of the new equipment should be available at the fall meeting.

**W8NBA 147.33 Repeater** – **IRLP NODE #8094** We now have a tab for "IRLP" to help you on your club webpage at <a href="www.corc.us">www.corc.us</a>. You can also get much information on IRLP at <a href="www.irlp.net">www.irlp.net</a> including node locations and general information. There are two additional receivers operating on 147.33. One is up North and the other is downtown. All of the receivers require 123.0 PL to access. The receive coverage is GREATLY improved.

**W8RRJ 146.97 Repeater** - We have added an additional receiver for the 146.97 repeater downtown. As with the other club 2 meter repeaters a PL of 123.0 is required.

There is a tab on the webpage called "Site Info". As soon as all the upgrades are done, it will be updated to reflect all the new receive sites for all the repeaters.

### **VERY IMPORTANT INFORMATION! HR 607**

This affects ALL of CORC's & others repeaters!
The government is trying to take 420-440 MHZ away from Amateurs!

This AFFECTS YOU! This is where repeater links are located!

To the many of you who have already written letters to your US Representative on HR 607, thank you. To you who have not gotten "a round tuit" and have not yet written, please **DO IT NOW**. The fate of the amateur secondary allocation 440 MHz band is at stake. This is a battle we can win. We are not the only group that would suffer from having HR 607 pass in its present form. Combined with the other groups, I feel confident we can prevail in having the offending part of the Bill removed. For example, the National Public Safety Telecommunications Council (NPSTC) has stated its support of the ARRL position (http://www.arrl.org/news/npstc-says-hr-607-needs-to-be-amended).

All that is needed is to insert your call sign where indicated and to click twice more to generate a letter addressed to your US Representative. The letter will be ready to print and for you to sign.

- Be sure to **sign your letter**. Letters without a handwritten signature are not effective.
- Send signed letters to John Chwat our legislative spokesman in Washington.

Do not send this letter or any letter about HR 607 to your US Senators at this time. The bill is only in the US House of Representatives.

Why send your signed letter to John Chwat? First, all postal mail to members of the US House (and other government bodies) is delayed 6 to 8 weeks in being searched for hazardous materials. Second, Mr. Chwat will increase the value of your individual letter by combining it with others and delivering a stack of letters directly to your Representative's office. This manner of delivery makes a particular impact on Congressmen.

If you feel it necessary to mail your letter directly to your Representative, do it. However, please also send a signed copy of it to Mr. Chwat for the reasons outlined above.

Thank you for your help and support in this **important** effort.

## Be a Good Neighbor Revisited

A lot of effort has gone into keeping the Central Ohio Radio Club repeaters in good working condition. Things break but they get quickly repaired and our repeater Trustees keep improving the systems to provide better reliability to the system. In fact the 16/76 W8RXX, 93/33 W8NBA and the 97/37 W8RRJ the systems are much better now than ever. Their coverage can be only described as GREAT! These machines have commercial quality high profile receivers that help them do their job, and if you haven't noticed it does take a PL Tone to access some of them, but it no longer requires a lot of power to access these Central Ohio repeaters.

There are other repeaters on these frequencies and from time to time we receive a complaint that our users are bringing up repeaters in other parts of Ohio or even in the neighboring states. Hams in Cincinnati, Cleveland, Wheeling and that state "up north" don't want to listen to one side of a Central Ohio conversation. The way to avoid this is to **ALWAYS** use the lowest power setting on your rig that will allow you to maintain communications. Don't try to DX the repeaters and keep that high power setting on your rig, power amplifiers and those very high gain antennas for simplex operation and even there you will not need it for local communications. If you have bragged about how much "smoke" you are running or that you are able to bring up the repeater after you have dropped over the normal radio horizon, you may be one of those Hams. If you haven't been "lucky" enough to receive a report from an Official Observer, keep it up and I am sure that there is one in your future or a report from a FCC Field Office that you are not operating in compliance with FCC Part 97.

Unless there is very strong storm that is causing major receiver desense and you have to get over it, always use the lowest power setting possible and reasonable antenna to carry out the desired communications.

## Travelin' Tony's Timetables

Good operating procedures on the radio allow for the efficient flow of communications on the air. Stations who wish to join in a conversation, or need to join due to an emergency, can do so without being intrusive.

Listed on the last two pages of the CORC Operating Manual (found on the CORC web page) are some guidelines for good operating procedures during the Weather Net, however they apply to everyday conversations as well. If it has been a while since you've read these I suggest a refresher review. In addition to what's listed, here are a couple other tips.

#### "Break"

The word "break", when used to jump into a conversation, should <u>only</u> be used in an emergency situation. If someone jumps in with "break", acknowledge the station and ask them to proceed with their emergency traffic. "Break" should never be used to join in on a conversation when it is not an emergency. If you wish to join a conversation, simply give your callsign between transmissions during the reset beep to let others know you are out there.

#### Net priority on the repeaters

The Central Ohio Severe Weather Net (COSWN) has priority over all other traffic on 146.760 and 444.200. While the readiness checks are scheduled for Tuesdays at 19:30 from Spring through Fall, the real nets can be called at any time. If you are talking on the repeater and someone from COSWN jumps in and says they need to start a net, you and any other stations in your conversation need to immediately relinquish the repeater to the net. The Weather Net control operator will give all stations the opportunity to state their callsign. Do it quickly so that the net can start.

Similarly, the Central Ohio Traffic Net (COTN) has been spending a significant amount of time on its backup repeater of 146.970. The net meets each evening at 19:15 (all are encouraged to join!). If you are on 146.970 having a conversation and the COTN net control jumps in and states that the net is about to start, immediately give your callsign and clear the frequency so that the net can proceed. Then when they ask for check-ins, state your call again and participate!

#### "Round Table" Discussions

The term "round table" simply means any discussion with more than two hams. Morning and afternoon rush hour drive times frequently have these types of conversations. A round table discussion could have three hams or thirty, but the protocol is the same regardless. The key is to remember who follows you in the discussion.

When you reach the end of your thought, state the callsign of the ham who should speak next. If you don't remember chances are the person who is supposed to speak next will do so anyway. Ultimately the point is to allow all involved in the discussion a chance to speak without excluding anyone. If someone new jumps in, acknowledge their call and allow them to speak next.

Remembering a few simple tips can ensure that everyone gets their chance to speak, and that everyone who needs to be heard, can be heard.

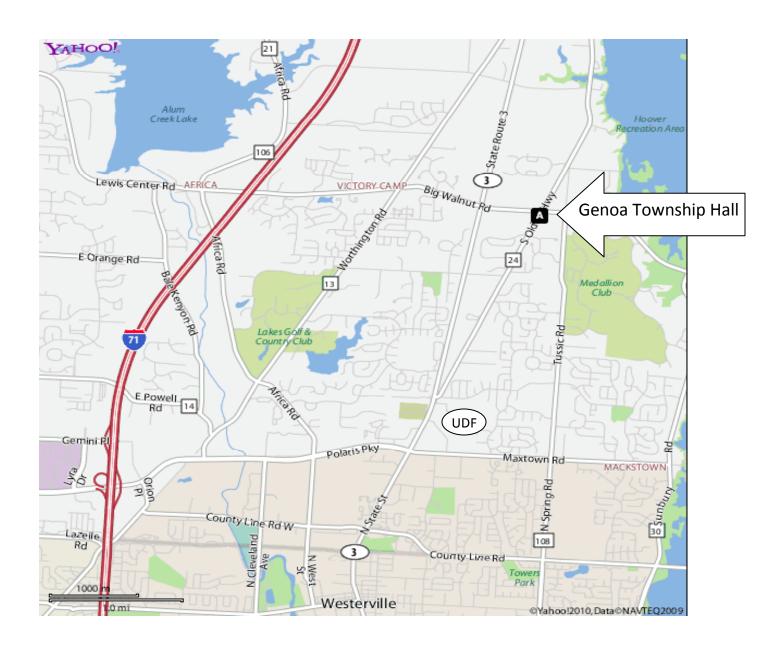
